Iver Heath Pavilion CCTV system

1.0 Introduction

The Ivers Parish Council is keen to develop a new CCTV system for the Iver Heath Pavilion and recreation ground that reflects both its commitment to deliver services within the Parish and its core principles of tackling anti-social behaviour and crime.

The current system has served the council well however it is very dated and is in need of a complete upgrade.

We also do not have the resources to provide a CCTV system that meets every eventuality and this outline is intended as a guide for potential tenderers to understand what the Council is seeking as a minimum.

2.0 What we would like our CCTV system to accomplish:

- We wish to be able to identify faces and number plates in the hours of darkness as well as the daytime
- We wish the council's buildings and garages to be covered by the system
- It is important that the system covers the car park and the entrance to the car park
- It is important that the front of the building that is open to public access is covered as well as the locked area to the rear of the building
- We would like all cabling to be in conduit
- We would like all old cabling and infrastructure and equipment to be removed
- We would like a wifi point provided as part of this development
- We would like the option to 'ping' a wifi signal to the youth shelter which we wish to be covered by CCTV

3.0 Resilience of CCTV to damage

We recognise that cameras can be targeted and we would like to deliver the most damage resistant system whilst providing a system that suits the budget of a Parish Council

4.0 Use of CCTV images

The Council shares an office with the Police and it is our aspiration that the recordings can be downloaded, appropriately, by us or the police in the office and provided in an appropriate format as evidence.
