

152	A5. The signage to Iver Heath Fields, Thorney Park, Hardings Row and Swan Meadows could be improved; a number of residents appear to be unaware of the existence of these sites. On the Ivers Parish Council website, entering on the search feature 'Hardings Row', 'Iver Heath Fields', 'Swan Meadows' and 'Thorney Park' gives 'No Results Found'; is this significant? Swan Meadows is currently something and nothing – I would prefer it to stay as a recreational space rather than a car park; however if car parking is essential it should be confined to a small area near the road.
155	Thorney Park is woefully neglected and has the potential to be something really amazing if resources were to be applied to it. It would need some commercial activity to sustain it such as a Sports and Leisure complex at its heart. Something that maybe Heathrow could provide as a quid pro quo for expansion. The mish mash of car breakers yards in the High Street. If these could be relocated then the area could accommodate parking and retail development with flats over.
159	Only as already answered build a big free Car Park in Thorney Lane South for Cars Only!!

This land has been looking tatty for years , with soil mounds top stop unwanted people using the land

189	The stretch of land in Swallow Street owned by South Bucks District Council between the bridleway/footpath and Seaburrow Farm. Floods every year and spills out onto the road and bridleway - could be dug out and made into a natural pond area - totally overgrown and never maintained, apart from when we phone and complain that you cannot walk on the path because of the brambles, nettles and overhanging branches - then it might be cut back if we are lucky.
191	The eastern end of the land to the west of Thorney Lane between the canal and the railway line. There is a tranche of greenbelt there which could be opened up for public use whilst providing access to the area to the west which could be developed for housing and light commercial use with the necessary medical, educational, retail and leisure facilities.

200	None known other than that we use already.
202	Iver rec. the cafe should be open more regularly for drinks/snacks/toilet facilities for everyone who uses the park. It's such a waste to have it only used by the football club occasionally and would mean that people could spend longer at the park and it would be far more child friendly.
206	I think we could do with better car parking for Iver High Street and the two pubs that aren't currently in use could be utilised for this purpose.
210	Iver Heath Rec always seems underused to me, any time I have been there it seems empty. Also the land between the church and the 5-points roundabout is still left empty despite signs noting changes that were supposed to happen
218	Land between The Swan Iver, Coppins Lane and the Colne Brook should be protected as a designated area for public recreational purposes.
238	No, there are sufficient recreational areas already in place.

239	A large area of land which is currently in the Green Belt is not accessible to the public. Release of some land for development would also deliver some public open space. Land which is currently not providing any public benefit could therefore be released to provide much needed homes and associated public open space. The land south of Richings Way could accommodate residential development as well as open space and a children's play area. This could be at the northern part of the site to allow convenient access from the surrounding residential area. It would align with Sport England's Active Design principles by providing a highly accessible, multifunctional open space in a high quality environment.
251	There are a number of areas adjacent to the M25 which are unsuitable for housing (due to noise pollution), but which could be used for public recreation.
254	Iver Heath recreation ground could be improved through the provision of better facilities in the Pavilion and re-designing the layout of pitches and facilities on the ground.
256	Gams field could be made more accessible, but not by the proposed development (dementia home) on this site. We shouldn't have to sell our soul and greenbelt to developers to get funding to make areas nice. There has never been a children's playground in walking distance to Richings Park and now that there are a lot more young families in the area it's important that this is supported by the council. Also, the area at the end of Old Slade Lane could be developed into open space for public recreation, dog walkers, bike riders etc.
