

151	No I would not support the centre for a secondary school. It should remain as a community centre within walking distance for residents of Iver.
152	A34. The Government has indicated that it would like new secondary schools to be in excess of 1000 pupils. This implies a significant number of employees who would mainly come to work by car, motorcycle or bicycle since public transport to the Evreham site is very poor. Also there would be school transport (ie buses) for pupils from outside the immediate area. In addition there would be pupils dropped off and collected by car. The current access to the Evreham site is either from the south along Love Lane, from the north along Swallow Street, or along Norwood Lane / Bangors Road South. These roads cannot take a significant increase in traffic. There is very limited car parking space along the roads close to Evreham, so it would be essential to build sizeable car parks for both staff and visitors (eg parents collecting pupils in the afternoons). A possibility would be to make a new entrance to the Evreham site from Wood Lane, but car parking would still be a major issue. Therefore I do not think that Evreham would be a suitable site for a secondary school for 1000+ pupils.
