

## Iver Village Noticeboard Provision

### 1.0 Background

The centre of Iver Village has 3 noticeboards placed in close proximity to the Parish Council Office. Two are positioned by the steps to the area outside the office and the other is placed on the brick paved area adjacent to the two parking spaces close to the Hub side of the Office building.

The two closest to the steps are used for parish notices, the third by the Hub is currently used to highlight activities at the Iver Heath Drama School. Of the two by the steps one has no locking mechanism (right in the first picture below) and is therefore only used as an overflow when the other gets full. Both are in poor visible condition with very poor visibility of notices through damaged and blurry screens, including vandalism. They do not match and are unattractive to the eye. The unlocked one has been used in a recent local harassment campaign and is now taped closed.



### 2.0 Recommendation

- a) Immediate removal of the damaged 'unlocked' noticeboard. It's believed this could be removed in-house and remedial repair to the edge of the pavement undertaken by our maintenance team.
- b) Consideration of replacing both Noticeboards with a three-bay noticeboard in the style of the one located at Slough Road (A4007) at Iver Heath. *Approximate cost is £1,700 – there is £5,000 in the 20/21 budget for Noticeboards*
- c) Re-establish control of the third by the hub to be a board where the Parish Council can display posters / flyers suitable for the community (e.g., Advertising the Coffee Morning at Iver Heath Pavilion on a Tuesday morning and other posters that arrive with the Parish Council and are appropriate to display)

The matter of Noticeboard refurbishment / replacement Policy will be agenda'd for a future meeting.
