Extract from an e-mail sent to the Deputy Clerk on Friday 11th March 2022:

Peter and I discussed the drainage near the court area of the Rec. At the last (I think) open spaces meeting we discussed alternative approaches to the path and funding. It is clear that the cause of the issues is the lack of natural drainage in that area. I believe that we need to insert agricultural pipe type drainage - this usually leads to a french drain type capture and release area. My terminology may not be correct - in Australia we simply call it agr pipe. This is piping that is porous and the water collects and is directed to another area. The piping is underground leaving the surface usable. Is this one of the alternative options that we are exploring? If not could it be explored please? Peter can provide the correct terminology, sorry sometimes I only know the Australian terms for items.

Motions:

- a) To task the Deputy Clerk to produce a plan as soon as possible to meet Grundon's requirement of a plan to show how the funding will be spent to further guarantee the funding
- b) To task the Deputy Clerk to explore further the option in the E-mail above from Cllr Cook with our civil engineering consultants
